Reading: Romans 13: 8 - 14

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, ' You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet ' ; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, ' Love your neighbour as yourself. ' Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law. Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Reflection

I think it was William Barclay who said that, "love is the debt that we can never hope to repay" and reading these words from Paul's letter to the Roman Church, we are very aware of how true this is. St. Paul points out how simple the whole law had become when he said, 'for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.' Before we get too excited, thinking that our deep love for a favoured few will suffice, we'd better realise that Paul is talking about every individual we shall ever meet or know of. So, although it seems the easy option, to love everyone certainly does not. Paul begins by telling us to pay our debts to each other; and here the saying from Shakespeare's Hamlet is very pertinent and wise, "Neither a borrower nor a lender be."

I can't believe this isn't from Proverbs, because it makes such good sense. However, what does it mean? I think we can understand it to say, if you really need something, ask for it without agreeing to pay it back or return it. There is no point promising what you can't hope to deliver, so it is better to cast yourself on someone's mercy in the first place. Every day we hear about the difficulties people get into because of short term loans, taken out in desperation, with little or no chance of ever being paid back. Our problem today is what else can desperate people do?

In years gone by they might have run to another country, joined the army or begged for mercy and help from a local lord or monastery. Today, there is a Christian initiative setup to help people with 'gifts' rather than debts. I think this is something all of our churches should get involved in as it often prevents homelessness, hunger, fear, and debt, all at the same time! Now, what about lending? Will an act of generosity turn into a difficult and unhappy situation if something is damaged or not returned? We honestly have to be very careful and make provision for whatever it is, to be 'written off' if, in the end, repayment is impossible; to be prepared to make it a gift, without destroying the borrower's life with guilt and worry. So, why would we ever do that? Well, we might, if it's our nearest and dearest who are involved.

Oh dear, do you see where our reading is leading us with all this? Paul says, 'all the commandments are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbour as yourself, " love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law' Jesus was very clear when asked by a teacher of the law, 'who is my neighbour?', that in his eyes, it was anyone in need (Luke 10: 25 -37). Perhaps we will need to put on our 'Jesus-tinted' glasses more often, until we can see need in the same way that he does. As we are loved to the uttermost, we know we can only begin to make down-payments on such a debt, if that is what God's love is. Fortunately, it is a gift not a debt, but because of it being so, we are then bound to share something so freely given. It cost Jesus his life to teach us this, let's give our lives to passing it on. **Amen.**

Loving God, we pray for ourselves and for each other. May we allow you to make us the people you created us to be as we seek together to build your kingdom wherever we live. Inspire us to help each other whenever and wherever we can. In Jesus' name we pray and say. **Amen.**
